A MESSAGE FROM GARY

Palm Sunday: the Way of Peace.

Today is the day we know in the Christian calendar as Palm Sunday. In our tradition it is a significant religious day marking the beginning of Holy Week.

But what was happening when Jesus entered Jerusalem? We know what the next few days will hold for Jesus. He will be betrayed, deserted, arrested, tried and crucified. Then in a week's time we will celebrate Christ's resurrection. All this took place around and during the festival of Passover which was perhaps the biggest festival in the Jewish calendar. As such, it was a time of heightened expectations, for the Jewish nation believed that Messiah would come at Passover and liberate them from oppressive rule.

To make sure matters didn't get out of hand, the Romans, those who ruled in Judea at this time, took measures to ensure religious passion didn't lead to riot. They did this by reinforcing their armed presence in the city. So, just before Passover, the governor would lead a procession of troops into the city, arriving from the West. It was a deliberate show of strength. It was designed to intimidate. Its message was clear- don't mess with us.

Around that time, perhaps even on the same day, Jesus arrived coming in from the East. Similarly, his entry was designed to make a statement. In coming in on a donkey Jesus was saying he was coming in peace to bring peace. It is believed that Jesus was enacting the words from the prophet Zechariah, "See your king comes to you... gentle and riding on a donkey." When kings came for war, they rode in on horses. When kings came in peace, they rode donkeys.

Jesus' entry into Jerusalem asks us to make a choice. Will I be an accomplice of violence or an agent of peace? Does my life sow seeds of peace and love or bitterness and hate? Am I able to cross enemy lines to extend a hand of friendship and love to those with whom I disagree?
