

A MESSAGE FROM ROB

Seeing Jesus?

In the process of moving to my first placement, I asked my predecessor his experience of transitions he had made from one placement to the next. He smiled and said something like: "Well, you have your farewell, the removalist comes and takes all your stuff away and about 6 months into the new ministry, a few people ask, "Whatever happened to Dave? Who's this new bloke?"

I found it humorous at the time but it later made me think deeply about what was going on in that situation. I wondered – and still do – how much does the person and the personality of the minister play in people's perceptions of how the congregation is going and why we are here?

I've found myself in our current time of transition as a congregation revisiting our reason for being here. Our Ministry Team is really important for its teaching, visioning and leadership – in other words modelling the life of Jesus.

In our gospel for today, some Greeks come to Philip the disciple with a request – "Sir, we want to see Jesus." My prayers and thinking recently have been dominated by this request because it's a question that can be asked of each one of us who are part of the BCUC church family. How do we as a congregation and as the individuals who worship and serve together, experience Jesus ourselves so that we can make Jesus visible to encourage faith in each other and our non-Christian friends and neighbours? And how can our Ministry Team develop and encourage this primary goal within every member of our congregation?

I hope you struggle with this as I have – and as I continue to do so.
